Pol Roger Cuvee Sir Winston Churchill

Epernay, France, 2004

“This wine has something for everyone. Rich and toasty notes are persistent, with enticing notes of red berries, white peach and flint. In the mouth it is delicate and creamy yet there is power and presence. It is a Champagne of great finesse. Remarkably balanced. Mature with dried figs and ripe drupe and complex with a toasted autolysis touch and biscuit on the finish.”

“Translucent, shimmering gold indicates a wine of poised ripeness; beautiful scents of orange blossom merge with sense of great chalky terroir. Also it also shows the essential true fruit now and for 20 years to come. Long lingering finish. A great supremely elegant Champagne.”

Majolini “Electo” Brut Millesimato

Franciacorta, Lombardy, Italy, 2005

A sparkling blend of Chardonnay and Pinot Nero, this opens with ripe aromas of melon and peach, backed by a hint of almond skin and a touch of zesty lemon rind. The fullness and generosity of the mouthfeel is capped by tonic, steady perlage.

Lucien Muzard Corton Charlemagne, Grand Cru

Burgundy, France, 2009

“Mid-intense fruit on the slightly reticent buttery nose. Dairy profile dominant with nutty oak toast complementing. Full-bodied, slightly oily and round on the palate with good balance. Some herbaceousness, slight florality, cream and chestnuts. Very long finish. Big and opulently stylish. The promise is there.”

Domaine Vincent Latour Mersault Charmes, 1er Cru

Burgundy, France, 2011

“Limpid and brilliant. Its bouquet has strong aromas of ripe grapes. The young wine is redolent of toasted almonds and hazelnuts in a floral and mineral setting. Butter, honey, and citrus fruits are also present. On the palate it is rich and fat with a cheerful and appealing taste of hazelnut. Unctuousness and freshness are in silky balance. Long and structured.”

Rhone Valley, France, 2012.

“Quite expressive nose, with notes of pear, apricot, orange, melon and floral scents, with a little anise. The palate is round with good freshness, despite low acidity, apple aromas and spices. It's wide, well done, and typed without any notable presence of alcohol.”

Famille Perrine, Chateauneuf du Pape, Rhone, France, 2009

“The 2009 vintage signs a great year. A vibrant wine with great balance. Beautiful deep black colour, a mature, fine and complex nose. This wine explodes on the palate with aromas of spices and liquorice, intense aromas of black fruit and chocolate and soft, silky tannins. We can easily say that is one of those bottles to have at least once in life.” 94 pt. \$385

Domaine du Pégau, “Cuvee Laurence”

Paul Ferraud et fille, Chateauneuf du Pape, Rhone Valley, France, 2004

“Nose of meat locker, blueberries and violets, shows continual evolution. Once tasted, all kirsch and violets, wild game, mint and garrigue. Balanced, silky tannins, but surprisingly not an overly long finish. The perfect example of a extraordinary Chateauneuf du Pape” 93 pt. \$365

“Marion” Amarone Valpolicella

Veneto, Italy, 2012

“Barbecued bacon leaps out of the sumptuous, lifted, alcoholic and rustic nose, with red and dark fruits. The tannins are very green and enormous for an Amarone. There is certainly enough here to carry through and improve until the tannins resolve.” 91 pt. \$315

Marchesi Mazzei “Mix 36”

Tuscany, Italy, 2011

“Blend of 36 clones of Sangiovese. Mazzei family and vineyard exist since the 15th century. Intriguing nose. The classic Italian style comes through clearly but with an interesting new world twist. A gentle use of wood. Palate holds up to what the nose promises, high acidity and good tannins giving the wine a very good structure, which is paired with a full body. Is not a social wine, but is better to enjoy with a classy and refined fancy dinner. Italian going modern well done.” 94 pt. \$265

E. Guidal Hermitage, Shiraz

Rhone Valley, France, 2009

“Dense purple color. On the nose it display spices, red berries and delicate oak aromas. The palate shows it's a powerful tannic wine. Aromas of blackcurrant and vanilla. Deep, rich and full-bodied. Licorice and spicy finish. This is a racy and seductive wine.” 91 pt. \$225

Prunotto Bric Turot Barbaresco DOCG

Piemonte, Italy, 2004

“Raspberry and red cherry aromas were accompanied by spices and herbs, with a well defined toastiness. In the mouth, high acidity, strong tannins and full body. Can't ask for more.” 90 pt. \$225

“Penetrating dark red fruit on the nose complemented by sweet spice, an intriguing earthiness and a hint of subtle well integrated oak. The palate is complex, vibrant and lively with good weight and persistent tannins that provide a wonderful structure and seductive mouthfeel.” 90 pt. \$195

A blend from seven different crus, fermented and aged separately until blended together and aged some more.” 89pt. \$165
